



**October 2025 – NoCo IMRG Membership Meeting
October 18th, 2025
Indian Motorcycle of Fort Collins**

Meeting called to order at 9:33 a.m.

President – Randall Holman

- Welcomed members to the October meeting with appreciation for everyone's continued engagement.
- Post chapter meeting ride - Howling Cow Café for lunch
- Recap of recent events
 - IMRG National Charity (FOH) ride (aka Cinnamon Roll Ride, Fall Colors Ride)
 - Breakfast & Backroads
 - Breakfast at Vern's Place
 - Rode around Horsetooth, Masonville, up Stove Prairie, back across Poudre Canyon
 - Good turnout for the Ride Ready Skills training provided by Paul Carroll
 - Thanked Paul for conducting the training
 - Thanked those that attended the training, and encouraged those that did not to come to a skills session
- Folds of Honor update
 - Nationally, IMRG raised \$201K (81% of the \$250K goal) (an increase of 77% from last year)
 - NoCo IMRG raised \$1,485 (297% of our \$500 goal)

- Northern Colorado IMRG Board members term ends December 31st.
 - Email requesting nominations for Board positions was sent out; received a few responses
 - Nominees were vetted
 - No formal election between candidates is needed for this October election,
 - The accepted nominees for Primary Board Officers are running unopposed, therefore are “Elected by Acclamation”
 - President – Randall Holman
 - Vice – Jerry Southworth
 - Secretary – Michelle Banks
 - Treasurer – Ted Wolfe
 - Other supporting roles will be appointed at the next Board meeting
- Discussed Polaris’ sell of Indian Motorcycle
 - Provided some details surrounding the sale as posted by Polaris and IMC
 - IMC will be its own standalone company (with majority stake holder Carolwood LP)
 - IMRG Regional Coordinators received email indicating IMRG will be an integral part of IMC (though we don’t know what that really means yet)
 - Strong leadership for the new IMC (CEO has long history in the motorcycle industry)
 - Dealerships across the nation are viewing this as a positive change
 - Singular focus on building the Indian Motorcycle brand without having to compete with other Polaris lines of business (OHV, snowmobile, watercraft, Slingshot)
- Ladies of NoCo IMRG
 - Introduced concept - internal community within the NoCo IMRG
 - Focus on interests of our Lady members
 - Goal is to encourage greater participation by women within our group
 - Offer role models for new women riders, and create more opportunities for social interaction
 - Can be rider, passenger
- King of the Baggers 2025 Season Ended
 - Passed out racing flags to everyone (provided by IMC) commemorating the season
 - Harley came out on top – winning back the #1 plate
- Bonneville Salt Flats – new speed record was set for the 2000cc Class
 - Tyler O’Hara – a member of the Indian Motorcycle “Wrecking Crew” set a new land speed record
 - Used Challenger similar to the one he raced in the King of the Baggers
 - New official record of 194mph
- Legends Never Die Tour
 - Being organized by a couple of Indian Motorcycle Ambassadors
 - Tour will travel the entire length of Route 66, starting in Chicago and ending in Santa Monica.
 - Help raise money for Folds of Honor charity
 - Stopping at various dealerships along the way, and other points of interest
 - Tour at your own pace (solo or with group), ride all or portion, stay where you want, see what you want
 - May 25th – June 3rd (10 Days)

 - 10/23 Thursday – Harvest Moon Dinner Ride; Moot House in Ft Collins; ride or drive; keep lookout for Punchbowl invite
 - 12/13 Saturday – NoCo IMRG Christmas Party (following Wreaths Across America); save the date, and keep lookout for Punchbowl meeting invite

 - Denny Pink correctly answered trivia question (In what year was Route 66 commissioned? Answer: 1926)
 - \$50 Dealership gift card – Denny graciously declined the card and it was given to Cressa Flint.
