



**April 2026 – NoCo IMRG Membership Meeting
April 18th, 2026
Indian Motorcycle of Fort Collins**

Meeting called to order at 9:35 a.m.

Leadership present: Randall Holman, Mark Whaley, Ted Wolfe, Karen Holman, Kenneth Camp, Jeff Sroufe

President – Randall Holman

- Welcomed members to the April chapter meeting.
- Provided recap of the chapter's March post meeting ride to Georgia Boys in Frederick
 - It was the chapter's very first group ride of the year.
 - A big turn-out for the ride (with near perfect riding weather – warm & sunny)
- April's post-meeting ride - Wellington to the T-Bar for lunch
 - Short relaxed "flat lander" ride
 - Level-2 ride on backroads
- Provided review of the Colorado Auto Show in Denver
 - Indian Motorcycle of Fort Collins was provided floor space at the Denver Convention center free of charge
 - Dealership took down several bikes to display – FTR, Pursuit, Challenger, Scout 101, Sport Scout, Roadmaster Elite, Chieftain, FTR
 - Some chapter members, and dealership employees worked the floor: Fri – Paul & Randall; Sat-Mark, Ted, Randall; Sun-Jeff, Steve
 - Very busy with lots of show attendee interest – particularly in the FTR, Scout 101, and Pursuit
 - Randall shared his excitement about meeting Rocco Landers, one of the King of the Baggers Indian Motorcycle Wrecking Crew, who came to our booth.
- Reminded the group about Express Lane Tolls
 - Express Lane tolling started on I25 between Berthoud & Fort Collins; Hwy56/Hwy14
 - Reminder, all Express Lanes are free for motorcycles
 - Exceptions: E-470; Northwest Parkway; I70 Mountain Express Lane Idaho Springs/Empire;

- Share insight on Vroom Old Man - Patrick Cornell
 - Pat started riding to raise donations for Myotonic Dystrophy (a form of muscular dystrophy)
 - Originally was riding 125K miles for \$125K; Fell short of raising \$125K so he kept going
 - Continued for 145K miles in 145 Days
 - Announced he would do 200K in one year - Ending April 30th
 - As of April 8th he turned over 195K (Entirely on a 2025 Indian Pursuit)
 - Yesterday (April 17th) his wife posted on their donation page they reached the \$125K goal.

- Provided update on South Region IMRG Roundup – Sept 9th-13th (Grand Junction)
 - Currently have a little under 50 registered participants (from 10 different chapters; both in & out of the South Region)
 - Grand Junction Indian Dealership was about to shut-down, but worked out a deal to stay with the new IMC

- Covered upcoming events
 - 4/23 (Thu) Dinner Ride. LaPorte Pizza. Meetup @6:00pm at Dealership/6:15KSU
 - 4/25 (Sat) Skills training at Timberline Church in Fort Collins: 11:00am.
 - 4/26 (Sat) Road Officer Orientation prior to skills @10:00am
 - i. Road Officers are the backbone of our group. They are responsible for planning, briefing, leading, and sweeping our rides throughout the year.
 - 5/2 (Sat) International Female Ride Day: Meet at Doug’s Diner in Mead followed by a ride
 - i. More details to come – Paul will plan and lead
 - For May Chapter meeting on the 16th
 - i. We will meet outdoors at the Timberline Church at 10:00am.
 - ii. Afterward, we will have a Skills training session

Guest Discussion – Paul Carroll

- April is “National Helmet Check Month.”
- Paul provided insightful information regarding helmets: why helmets matter, helmet types, helmet safety ratings, choosing the right helmet.
- Key takeaways: wearing a helmet reduces risk of a fatal head injury by ~37%; helmets should be replaced every 3-5 years (due to breakdown in structural integrity).

Dealer Advisor – Jeff Sroufe

- Durango Rendezvous
 - Provided update regarding Durango Rendezvous and discussion with Terry Connett
 - Registrations for the Durango Rendezvous were very low – at risk of being canceled
 - Mike Kennedy (CEO of IMC) connected with Terry to help promote
 - Registrations are up and healthy with backing from IMC
 - Terry excited about this year’s Rendezvous

- Provided commentary regarding Colorado Auto Show
 - Presence at the show was more about promoting the IMC brand, and not the dealership
 - The auto show was much smaller compared to prior years
 - Thanked the IMRG for helping out at the show

- Giveaway item
 - Jeff received some nice leather travel pouches featuring the headdress insignia.
 - Everyone who attended the chapter meeting was provided with one.
